SARKAR SAMAKULAM PROJECT

Sarkar Samakulam is expected to receive water through the Athikadavu Avinashi Scheme (Farmers' Project), which was launched in the early 2019 by our Tamilnadu State Government. Athikadavu Avinashi Scheme is implemented in order to divert the surplus water of Bhavani River to the Lakes, Ponds and other Water Bodies in the drought prone regions of Coimbatore, Tirupur, Erode and thereby boost the ground water tables.

RAAC being involved at SS Kulam Lake has approached Robert Bosch for the two phased focus in rejuvenating the Lake. As part of phase - I, the intervention with the support of Robert Bosch will focus on plantation of native trees and ancillary support like customized container for storing tools, toilet facilities, fencing and gates to prevent cattle rearing within the plantation sites will be provided. Honey bee cages & Watering pots for Birds will be placed to improve biodiversity of the lake.

RAAC in association with Robert Bosch – CSR Activity come forward to restore the Water Body near the Bosch neighbourhood and to promote the Solid Waste Management at the village.

Keeranatham is home to numerous companies and is also referred as the "IT Hub of Coimbatore". There is tremendous growth in this region and parallel has resulted in various challenges such as Air, Water and Land Pollution. Keeranatham has an intricate network of streams and lakes originally constructed for inland water transportation. Over a period of time the streams have turned into sewers owing to indiscriminate dumping of Solid and Liquid wastes.

Waste is being dumped into the stream outside the SEZ Campus by the Residents and Shop Owners residing in that area. The waste has toxified the surroundings and has raised an alarming situation for the Associates. RAAC had identified that the stream enters into the Keeranatham Village from Samranikuttai leading to the flat plains and arrives at Nallasamy Check Dam.

STRENGTHENING OF FIVE PRIMARY HEALTH CENTERS AT RURAL AREA

The Covid - 19 Pandemic has caused enormous collateral damage to the overall health system in India. The Indian Public Health System is a tiered structure where at the bottom of the pyramid are sub centers, catering to a population of 3000 to 5000 each, roughly five villages.

As a CSR initiative of Robert Bosch Engineering and Business Solutions, RAAC and EGAM Foundation has joined hands with them to upgrade the PHC's. Equipment's and Training System for the 5 PHC's namely Sarkar Samkulam, Vellakinar, Daliyur and 24 Veerapandi. We have planned to do this project with a cost of 1.4 Crores (70 Lakhs for Infrastructure and 70 Lakhs for the Medical Equipment's and Training). The project inauguration function was held on 22.02.2021 at Sarkar Samakulam PHC's with laying stone for the Compound Wall and Supplied the Medical Equipments for the Primary Health Center. So that the people in and around the Sarkar Samkulam will be benefitted.

Our MLA Sri. V.C. Arukutty inaugurated the function and Our District Collector presided over the function. Other District Health Department Officials, Bosch Officials, RAAC and EGAM Officials attended the function.

OXYGEN GENERATION PLANT SET UP AT PSG HOSPITAL

The second surge of Covid-19 in India has exposed the precarious state of India's healthcare system. Across all cities and towns : beds, oxygen, medicine and ambulances ran out, leaving Citizens running helter-skelter to sustain their lives. One of the key resources that left many grappling was the requirement for Oxygen whose intrinsic value was imbibed manifold times during the Pandemic. Oxygen features on the World Health Organisation (WHO) model list of essential medicines. Before the second wave, India required 700-800 tones per day of medical oxygen. This increased to 3,500-4,000 tonnes per day by the second week of April - a jump of over 400 per cent thereby putting immense pressure on oxygen manufacturing units in the country.

Oxygen that could have helped to revive lakhs of lives across the Nation. This brings forth the requirement of having an Oxygen Generation Plant set up at Hospitals so that the external dependence is minimized and the focus would be to just save lives with the availability of Oxygen in the Campus. Under the RBEI/CSR: Rehabilitative Theme to combat Covid Wave #2 it is decided to invest in an Oxygen Generation Plant at charitable hospitals in Coimbatore. After having scrutinized upon the many organizations, it is decided to invest in an Oxygen Generation Plant at PSG Hospitals Coimbatore considering the factors of healthcare accessibility, affordability, availability of trained medical professionals, technical capability and charitable nature of the institution.

The Management Meeting was set up with the PSG Hospitals to understand the support extended to economically weaker sections, the need for the Plant and their commitment to serving the populace of Coimbatore PSG is a 1200 Bedded Hospital with an Exclusive 500 Bed Setup to treat Covid Patients including a 45 Bedded ICU. Ever since the Pandemic broke out in 2020, close to 12,000 Patients have been treated at PSG. 50% of the Beds are under Free Category and the remaining 50% of the Beds are under subsidized charges. Close to Rs.7 Crores is waived off as subsidized treatment charges. 50% of the Covid Beds are with Oxygen Support.

MASTER PLAN

RAAC Office Bearers met our District Collector Dr. Sameeran IAS on July 30th 2021 with the documents and pictures that could be included in the proposed Master Plan for Coimbatore.

Proposal included regarding the Building Regulations, Satellite towns, Industrial Parks, Sports Facilities & Semmozhi Poonga. Roads Transport Metro Rail, Flyovers, Ring Roads, Missing Link Roads, Rail over Bridges, Truck Terminals, Uppilpalayam Flyover.

In the year 2007 we have submitted to The Hon. Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu (then Dy. Chief Minister) our suggestions for Master Plan and Building rules along with 2 lakh signatures from Coimbatore Citizens. He was kind enough to look into our request and he implemented 4 link roads during World Tamil Conference held in Coimbatore.

We had the opportunity to meet Thiru E V Velu Honorable Minister for Public Works and Thiru K Ramachandran, Honorable Minister for Forests in the Coimbatore Circuit house on 10th August 2021. Coimbatore District Collector Dr. Sameeran, Coimbatore Corporation Commissioner Mr. Rajagopal, Mr. Murugesan, Mr. Balamurugan, Mr. Chandrasekar, Chief Engineers of Highways looking into different verticals were present.

The infrastructure requirements of Coimbatore City and District was presented by Dr. S V Balasubramanian & Smt. Vanitha Mohan our Vice President along with Mr. Venkatesh and Mr. J Sathish Our Managing Committee Members.

We requested Flyover from Ganapathy to Saravanampatty was emphasized with the Hon. Minister and he assured that he would look into each of issues in detail and give priority to the Sathyamangalam road Flyover.

He also assured that the representations will be followed up personally with other departments in Chennai and Delhi.

The proposal RAAC gave to build a road on Sanganur Stream bund is finalized. Road Laying work for a width of 21 feet on the bund of Sanganur Stream for a distance of 3.5 Kms at a cost of 80 crores is finalized

It will connect Mettupalayam road and Avinashi Road which will be executed in two phases. Tender awarded for the work for a total cost of 49 crores. Work will start soon and it will be completed in two years.

AGRAHARASAMAKULAM LAKE RESTORATION

Agrahasamakulam Lake is a major water source in the Phase 1 of Athikadavu - Avinashi ground water recharge scheme of the state government – presently under implementation

The entire lake has to be revived and desilted. The zone is dense and abundant in black soil. Presence of black soil surpasses the water without recharging in the ground level hence recharge wells to be constructed within the lake area.

The streams have to revive and bund formation has to be done properly. The silt level is abundant within the lake and has to be evacuated so the capacity of the tank is increased and restored to its original level. The silt shall be utilized for farming needs of all the stake holders, through a system administered by the District revenue authorities. Contour survey of the entire lake is indeed to conclude the project. The criticality is that the Athikadavu - Avinashi ground water recharge scheme is in pipe line hence the revival of the tank under the said project is on high priority.

Green cover project with native trees have to be taken up in an area of 3 acres outside the tank 9. The tank is a crucial bird spot and around 47 species are observed since the last 3 years the green cover bio-diversity will improve the spot for birds and other species WORK CARRIED OUT SO FAR – SINCE SEPTEMBER 2021.

1. All the streams inlets of the tank have been cleared bushes have been evacuated
2. Prosopis juliflora has been cleared 70% within the lake
3. The west boundary of the lake has been revived and the bund is lifted up
4. Digital survey to ascertain the contour level has been carried out
5. Island formation is under progress within the lake for the biodiversity of the tank
6. Awareness boards have been fixed within the vicinity of the tank

The team is working consistently for about 50 + weeks till now and creating continuous awareness about the revival and maintenance of the tank and its water ways to the stake holders and people surrounding the lake area.

WORK TO BE CARRIED OUT:

1. Streams have to shaped properly & bund formation to be done in all the 5 stream inlets
2. Silt has to be completely evacuated within the tank area
3. Recharge well have to constructed within the tank – 5 to 10 nos
4. Contour level of the tank has to improved according to the outcome of the digital survey
5. The east and the south boundary of the tank have to be strengthened before water is filled up
6. Plantation activities have to be carried out to improve the biodiversity

KOTHAVADY WATER BODY RESTORATION

RAAC is association with EPPINGER TOOLING ASIA PVT LTD., come forward to restore the Kothavady Water Body located in the South part of Coimbatore in Kinathukadavu Taluk. The tank is spread out in an area of 314 acres and this is the primary water source and largest water body between the South part of Coimbatore and the north part of Pollachi. The tank was known to be found and traced back more than 700 years and is under the control of the Govt through Public Works Department (PWD) of the state.

The tank gets water from the supply channel from the catchment area plains such as Mettuvavi village, Panapatti village, Pogampatti village, Mandrampalayam village, Arasam palayam village, Karaseri village, Thegani village, Kondampatti village, Vadasithur village and Kurunallipalayam villages totally covering an area of 10 square kilometers the actual catchment area and about 20 kilometers long water supply channel connecting to the tank and the rain water collected through all these streams and supply channel fill the tank with sufficient water.

Kothavadi tank is located in Kurunallipalayam village of the south side of Coimbatore next to the south of Podhanur and Chettipalayam areas. The Kothavadi tank is the only largest water source within the vicinity of 40 kilometers surrounding the tank. The villages surrounding the tank are draught prone and scarcity of ground water /drinking water is very high. The ground water level is below 1000 feet on an average and rainfall has come down drastically. Once the tank is revived completely and filled with water this will result in enhancing the ground water table and ensure drinking water, cattle-farming needs and industrial utilization.

RAAC & EPPINGER as a CSR Activity come forward to restore the Kothavadi Water Body at the Cost of 85 Lakhs. The Work is under process.






